Professor Dame Xiangqian (Jane) Jiang

Professor of Precision Metrology University of Huddersfield

Biography:

Royal Academy of Engineering/Renishaw Chair in Precision Metrology, University of Huddersfield

Jane is a Professor of Precision Metrology at the University of Huddersfield's Centre for Precision Technologies. She is the Director of the EPSRC Future Metrology Hub. She obtained her PhD in measurement science in 1995, a Professorial Chair in 2003 and a DSc for Precision Engineering in 2007.

Jane is leading the creation of the concept of the 'Factory on the Machine' and 'Manufacturing Infratechnology' for future Manufacturing and is an internationally respected research leader in advanced metrology. She was awarded a Royal Society Wolfson Research Merit Award, the Outstanding Woman of Achievement 2006 in the Lloyds TSB AWA (Asian Women of Achievement Awards), the Sir Harold Hartley Medal, an IET Innovation Award and also received a Damehood in the 2017 Queen's Birthday Honours for services to manufacturing and engineering.

Maggie's school years were spent at local primary and secondary schools where she achieved sufficient academic qualifications but excelled at sport, in particular netball. Maggie was selected to represent England at Netball and spent the following 13 years representing England various age groups and travelled around the world.

Aged 20, Maggie joined West Yorkshire Police where at the time only a handful of black individuals were represented and even less were females. Her policing career spanned 30 years and was extremely diverse. Some of the positions held were general patrol duties, Surveillance Squad, Child Protection, Force Operations, VIP Protection and promotion to Sergeant.

After retiring from the police, Maggie spent 2.5 years as the Security Manager at The University of Huddersfield and after leaving that role now works as a Netball Coach working with Elite athletes within the newly created Netball Super league franchise Leeds Rhinos
