




"Everyone has a degree nowadays"



- 47.4% of UK adults (16-64) were graduates at the end of 2024
- Fewer than half of students currently aged 14-18 will ever go to University, and it's unlikely we'll ever see a situation where half even of a given age group goes to University





• "Young people with a higher degree – such as a master's degree – earned 58% more than those from the same socio-economic background with no GCSEs. Young people with an undergraduate degree earned 48% more."







"There aren't any jobs for graduates"



- Annual Population Survey (APS) data showed that at the end of 2024, there were 17.5m people working in professional-level jobs in the UK, this is 2 million more than just 5 years ago.
- In that time, the HE sector has seen 2 million new graduates from First Degree courses across the UK.

UK's leading employers' graduate recruitment:

Despite the country slipping into recession in the second half of 2023, leading graduate employers are offering 1.5% more graduate vacancies inn 2024, compared to 2023

Graduate recruitment target by industry or business sector in 2024, e.g.
Engineering & Industrial + 20.8%, Oil & Energy + 18.1%, Public Sector + 9.4%, Retail +9.1%, Law + 7.8%

For the third year running graduate starting salaries at the UK's leading graduate employers are set to increase in 2024, to a new median starting salary of £34,000


