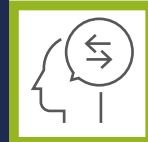
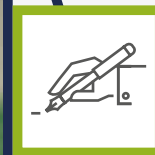


Interview Skills

- Be friendly and polite
- Listen carefully to all questions
- Chat to current students and staff

- Reasons for applying
- Present course of study
- Knowledge & experience of a subject or field
- Personal qualities
- Interests and work experience

How to answer

- Be positive
- Be honest
- Be concise
- Avoid yes/no
- Ask questions
- Volunteer info
